

Meeting called to order at 7:00 PM by Council President.

Council President led pledge of allegiance:

Hearing of person: Annie Kileen requested update of work and of paving of 4th Street. PWD stated water line will be replaced from Coplay Street to Hokendauqua Street. Gas line was updated and no need to update sewer line. Curb to curb paving will be done when work is completed.

PWD Boyle: Void was repaired to 157 South 4th from water main break at 4th and Schreiber. Pickleball court has been paved, gate & fence are up and project is close to being completed. Acrylic coating is currently being placed and graphics. Court will be Coplay colors of maroon and gray. PWD will gather prices for additional benches and a picnic table for area around new court. New A/C was replaced in police server room. New Roof at Balliet Stadium field was completed, a new vent cover is needed from storm. The ball field grant will be closed soon.

BCO Helman: May permits issued: 2 building, 0 electric, 1 plumbing, 1 mechanical, 3 zoning, 1 quick ticket, 6 moving permits. C/O: 13 units, 5 houses, 2 reinspection's= \$1,615.00

June permits issued: 4 building, 3 electrical, 0 plumbing, 0 mechanical. 1 driveway, 1 quick ticket. C/O: 3 units, 6 houses, 3 re-inspections \$960.00

Emerich: Police Department fines: \$520.00. Extended gratitude to PW for repainting speed lines. Total of 72 traffic stops. 21 traffic arrests. 240 incidents and 4 arrests. 2 new officers sworn in. Awards ceremony for Officer Dunleavy awarded for Valor. Officer Araujo for Courage, Officer Trauger: merit award for working with people suffering with mental health. Thanked the Mayor for passion and vision in what the department should look like and for setting goals. The background check was completed for Jacob Looney. Thanked council for expeditious ruling. Mr. Looney has accepted Coplay's offer and is expected to start the end of July for 3-4 month rotation. He is a competitive shooter and bicycle enthusiast. Been in contact with St. Pete to have an officer present during their homecoming picnic and also to have an officer at Community Days. James is doing great with training and is on track to be released for solo duty. Officer Morris surgery was successful. Radios were installed by Ecco. Ecco worked on tower and install in cars. Portable radios are programmed with future necessary minor programming. Old radios will be given to PW. Hosting a Taser 10 Course Oct 26th, 27th. Requesting reservation of the majority of the building and outside for training. A/c unit in upstairs and council chamber are the same unit and need to both be on heat or cool. PD will not pursue the very involved PCCD grant, will apply for the LSA.

Acela temporarily shift resources to focus on multimodal grant project due to critical schedule and Penn dot coordination requirements. Grant is in review phase. Chestnut Street calming study, active working on and compiling and evaluation available data. Will have report by Friday June 12.
